Unmasking Women's Potential through Education

Heather Callow, Ph.D received her BA and MA in English with a concentration in American literature from the University of Michigan. Her doctorate, from Johns Hopkins University, concentrated in British and Irish literature. Callow taught for many years at George Washington University in Washington D.C.

As the wife of an American diplomat who served overseas, Dr. Callow spent considerable time as a visiting professor. In the mid-nineties the couple spent two years in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia where her husband headed the political-military section of the American Embassy and Dr. Callow was a Fulbright Lecturer in American Literature at the Women's Division of King Saud University.

In her talk "Teaching Western Literature to Saudi University Women" she will draw on her experiences with students and faculty to provide a window into the world of women under Wahhabism, an extremely conservative form of Islam. Dr. Callow has helped to unmask the potential of women through education.
